The DSCC also calculates inmate sentences under federal law. Calculating the prison term in the federal system is not an easy task. On October 12, 1984, President Reagan signed the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984 (CCCA). The two main components of the Act, the Sentencing Reform Act of 1984 (SRO) and the Madness Reform Act of 1984, have completely rebuilt the guidelines and sentencing policies of the United States courts. Although there is no more parole in the federal system, every inmate can earn a good behavior time (Good time). Thus, your sentence has the potential to be reduced each year that you serve with good behavior. Your offer starts on the day of your arrival and credit is given during the first full day, even if you can only arrive part of the day. BOP is fully responsible for calculating federal prison terms (TK Prisonology BOP Sentencing Computing Guide.pdf). The good news here is that your first day in prison is also your shortest. A prisoner serving a sentence of more than one (1) year's imprisonment may receive a loan of up to 54 days of good time at the end of each year of the prisoner's imprisonment, subject to institutional rules. The loan for the last year or part of a year's imprisonment is proportionate and is credited within the last six weeks after the sentencing. It's harder what it sounds like, but as a general calculation, your prison term can be calculated by multiplying the number of months in prison given by 87.4% (0.874). This gives you approximate time you will be imprisoned. You'd spend some of that in a federal prison and a smaller part in a halfway house. For example, a person receiving a 30-month prison sentence will serve a total of 26.22 months (26 months and 7 days). If she had received four months halfway home, she would have spent 22 months and seven days in prison and four months in a halfway house. In addition to obeying the BOP rules to qualify for a good time, you must have: either a GED diploma, a high school diploma or a better one, or work towards one, and a sentence of one year and a day to qualify for the maximum permissible good time. If you have been arrested on the current charge and have spent time in prison before sentencing, you will receive credit for the time you have already served. However, if you had a bail requirement that included electronic monitoring or before trial, or probation, this time is not counted in any term of imprisonment. Once placed in its designated facility, a federal prisoner is generally not entitled to transfer 18 months during which she must maintain good behavior. However, if a treatment program is in need (particularly RDAP) or the medical needs of a prisoner cannot be met at the current facility, transfers can be made regardless of the time in the facility.
